






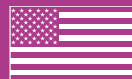

## CONDITIONS

### PERSONAL ITEMS

Aisle ways and vestibules must be kept clear of obstructions at all times. Passengers are reminded to use the overhead racks or space under the seats for such items as briefcases, luggage, handcars, or baby strollers.

### RADIOS

Radios may be played with headsets or earphones only at a volume that does not disturb other passengers.

### CELLULAR PHONES

Be considerate. Speak softly when using cellular phones on-board trains.

### IN-LINE SKATES

The wearing of in-line skates (rollerblades) will not be permitted on-board trains.

### PETS

Only service animals accompanying passengers with disabilities or their trainers, police dogs and small pets in carry-on travel cages are allowed on-board NJ TRANSIT trains.

### SMOKING

Smoking is prohibited on all NJ TRANSIT trains, in all stations, enclosed platform waiting areas, and designated areas on platforms.

### BICYCLE POLICY

Collapsible bicycles are permitted on all NJ TRANSIT trains at all times. Standard frame bicycles are only permitted in accessible cars and are not permitted on peak period, peak direction trains (inbound 5:00 a.m. to 9:30 a.m.; outbound 4:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.). Bicycles will not be accepted on major holidays. Visit Customer Service Offices in Newark, New York or Hoboken, or call Customer Service for details. Bicycle storage is available at most stations. For locker information, call 1 (973) 491-7587.

### REFERENCE NOTES

**Service will not operate** on Saturdays, Sundays, and major holidays (New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day).

Limited service will operate on Martin Luther King Day and Presidents' Day (see notes below schedule panels).

### ACCESSIBLE SERVICES

Stations with the above symbol are accessible to customers using mobility devices. For assistance on and off the train, please inform the train person or an NJ TRANSIT representative. When traveling to New York, inform the train person if you need to use an elevator upon arrival in New York. When departing from New York, contact NJ TRANSIT or Amtrak Customer Service to help you determine which elevator to use to access your train. When traveling from Hoboken, please arrive at least 15 minutes before your scheduled departure time and notify an NJ TRANSIT representative for assistance when boarding the train.

### HAVE A SAFE TRIP

- Cross tracks only at designated locations such as underpasses, overpasses, and grade crossings. Never go around the lowered gates at a grade crossing.
- Don't walk in front of a train, even if the train is stopped.
- Overhead electrified lines pack a lot of power. Don't go near them!
- Always stand behind the yellow line while waiting for your train.
- Watch the gap between the platform and train when boarding or detraining. Never get on or off a moving train.
- When riding on trains never lean on any doors or ride in the vestibule.
- In case of an emergency, listen to announcements and follow the instructions of the train crew. In case of smoke or fire, go to an adjoining car or, if instructed by the train crew, evacuate through the nearest exit. Directions to open doors and emergency windows are displayed near all exits.

## CONNECTING SERVICE

**NJ TRANSIT** takes you to Hoboken Terminal where you can make all the right connections:

### TO NEW YORK

**No. 126 BUS** offers frequent service from Hoboken to the Port Authority Bus Terminal in Midtown Manhattan. Monthly rail ticket holders may purchase a reduced rate monthly #126 Bus sticker for unlimited rides. One-way tickets are available at Hoboken Terminal.

**No. 181 BUS** offers service from Hoboken to the George Washington Bridge in New York. Call 1 (800) 772-2222 for specific schedule information.

**PATH** rail service at Hoboken Terminal takes you directly to downtown New York and midtown Manhattan at Christopher St., 9th St., 14th St., 23rd St., and 33rd St. Call 1 (800) 234-PATH for information.

**NY WATERWAY** provides convenient commuter ferry service directly to lower Manhattan. The ferry entrance is next to Track 15 at Hoboken Terminal. Call 1 (800) 53-FERRY for information.

Please refer to the suggested PATH and NY Waterway Ferry connections listed in your schedule. Remember that during the evening peak period (4:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.) it is difficult to hold trains for delayed connecting services because of the tight schedule in which we operate our equipment.

### TO OTHER NJ TRANSIT RAIL LINES

NJ TRANSIT rail lines that serve Hoboken Terminal include: Morris & Essex Lines, Boonton Line, Main/Bergen County Lines, and limited North Jersey Coast Line and Raritan Valley Line service.

### TO NEWARK INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT NEW NEWARK INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT (EWR) SERVICE

Direct rail service to the Port Authority of NY&NJ's Newark International Airport Station will be available on the Northeast Corridor (NEC) and North Jersey Coast Line (NJCL) with connections at major terminals from all lines. Only magnetically coded one-way tickets or monthly passes for travel to or from the airport allow passage through the fare gates at the station. An access fee is included in the cost of the ticket or pass. Tickets for use at Newark International Airport Station are available from ticket vending machines (TVMs) on the NEC, NJCL, and Raritan Valley Line, at Hoboken Terminal, and Summit, Westfield and Newark Broad Street stations. You can also purchase these tickets from TVMs and ticket agents at Penn Station New York (PSNY), Newark Penn Station (NPS), and Trenton Station. The access fee for passengers traveling through Newark International Airport Station without a magnetic ticket is \$5.00 of which \$3.50 is collected on behalf of the Port Authority of NY&NJ. These tickets are available from TVMs at the station. For more information on NJ TRANSIT's Newark International Airport Station service see a NEC or NJCL timetable or call 1-800-626-RIDE. **Opening date will be announced.**

**AIRLINK** bus provides express service from Newark Broad Street Station to Newark International Airport. Just take the Morris & Essex Line from Hoboken Terminal to Newark Broad Street Station to get convenient airport service every 20 minutes on weekdays from 6:00 a.m. to 2:00 a.m. and every 30 minutes on weekends and holidays between 6:30 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. Service will be suspended in or about January 2002.

### TO TRANSPORT OF ROCKLAND

We connect with buses to Pearl River, Nanuet, and Spring Valley stations. Call 1 (845) 364-3333 for information.

### METRO-NORTH RAIL LINES

Service in New York State is operated under contract with Metro-North. Passengers traveling to/from Metro-North stations will be charged a \$2.00 penalty, if ticket office is open.

**NJ TRANSIT** cannot assume responsibility for inconvenience, expense, or damage resulting from errors in timetables, delayed trains, failure to make connections, or for shortage of equipment.

## ADDED TRAVEL FLEXIBILITY

Your weekly or monthly rail pass with Hoboken Terminal as a final destination is good on NJ TRANSIT bus routes during weekends and off-peak weekdays for travel between rail stations listed below and the Port Authority Bus Terminal. This program is not valid on weekdays when traveling on buses to New York between 6:00 a.m. and 8:30 a.m. and on buses departing New York between 4:30 p.m. and 7:30 p.m.

If Hoboken is the final destination on your monthly or weekly commutation pass, you may ride to the Port Authority Bus Terminal in New York at no extra charge. This special pass honoring benefit is good all day Saturdays, Sundays and major holidays, and on weekdays except 6:00 a.m. to Hoboken and 4:30 p.m. - 7:30 p.m. to Westwood.

On weekends and major holidays, monthly and weekly passes from Pearl River, Nanuet, and Spring Valley may be used at no additional charge for travel on Metro-North's Hudson Line trains operating between Tarrytown and Grand Central Terminal. **FEEDER FARES** are available to monthly and weekly rail pass holders while traveling onboard NJ TRANSIT buses within the state of New Jersey. The feeder fare program is not valid on bus routes that cross the New Jersey state boundaries. Check with your bus operator for exact fare amounts.

## TICKET OPTIONS

Whether you're an occasional rider or a daily commuter, NJ TRANSIT has the ticket that's right for you!

**MONTHLY PASSES** are the best buy for commuters. They save you approximately 30%\* and are valid for unlimited trips throughout the calendar month.

**WEEKLY PASSES** are convenient commutation tickets. They save you approximately 15%\* and are valid from Saturday through the following Friday.

**10-TRIP TICKETS** consist of 10 one-way trips taken within two months from the date of purchase.

**ONE-WAY TICKETS** can be used for one continuous ride between designated stations and are valid for one year in addition to the date of purchase.

**ROUND TRIP EXCURSION TICKETS (RTX)** save you up to 25%\* off the cost of two regular one-way tickets. They are valid only in the direction indicated on the ticket. RTX tickets are not valid during weekday morning peak periods when your final destination or transfer terminal is Penn Station New York or Newark, Newark Broad Street Station or Hoboken Terminal. Travel to or transfer at these terminals during the weekday morning peak period requires payment of the full one-way fare from your origin station. See shaded area on this schedule for affected trains.

### REDUCED FARE PROGRAM

Senior Citizens 65 and older and passengers with disabilities can travel on-board NJ TRANSIT trains at a reduced fare of one half the regular fare or less at all times (except on peak period trains noted in the shaded area of rail timetable). An NJ TRANSIT Reduced Fare ID or Medicare Card is required to obtain the reduced fare.

Senior Citizens (62 to 64 years of age) are eligible for a reduced fare of one half the regular fare or less on-board NJ TRANSIT trains that are scheduled to depart between 9:30 a.m. and 4 p.m. and between 7 p.m. and 6 a.m. on weekdays, and all day Saturdays, Sundays, and state holidays. An NJ TRANSIT Reduced Fare Card is required for travel.

### CHILDREN'S FARES

Children, ages five through 11, save more than 50%\* and up to three children, four years and under, ride free when they are accompanied by a passenger paying any fare except a child or student fare.

**FAMILY SUPERSAVER FARES** are available on trains and buses during weekends and holidays from 7 p.m. Friday (or the day before a holiday) until 6 a.m. Monday (or the day after a holiday). Two children, ages five through 11, may travel free with a passenger paying any fare except a child or student fare.

**STUDENT MONTHLY PASSES** are available. Please ask your ticket agent for details.

**GROUP RATES** are available for special group trips or excursions. Call the Group Sales Office at 1 (201) 714-2880 for information.

**NEWARK INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT STATION** Only Monthly Passes and One-Way Tickets are available for travel to and from the station. Reduced Fare and Promotional Fare discounts are not applicable on the Access Fee.

**METRO-NORTH** customers who also use NYC subways and buses save big on a monthly combination Metro-North/MetroCard Gold ticket when you purchase it by mail through Metro-North's Mail & Ride Program. Call 1 (800) METRO-INFO; in NYC, call 1 (212) 532-4900.

## PURCHASING YOUR TICKET

**TICKET OFFICES AND TICKET VENDING MACHINES (TVM)** Be sure to purchase your ticket before boarding the train when a ticket agent and/or a TVM is available. At TVMs, you can purchase your ticket with a credit card, debit card, or cash. Customers with a personal check or TransitChek voucher must go to the ticket window or a major terminal. Most ticket types are available from the machines except 10-Trip tickets and student monthly passes. In addition, PATH 20 and 40 Trip QuickCards are available from certain machines.

**TICKET PURCHASES ON-BOARD TRAINS** Train personnel can accept cash only, and can not accept bills over \$20.00 for ticket purchases. **Passengers boarding without tickets will be charged a \$3.00 penalty if ticket vending machines are available, or the ticket office at their boarding station is open.**

**EXTENSION OF JOURNEY FEE** is a one-way fare between your final destination printed on your ticket/pass and your final travel destination. (With the exception of Change-In-Terminal Fee, see below.)

**CHANGE-IN-TERMINAL FEE** is charged when you use a ticket/pass to travel to/from a terminal (Penn Station New York, Hoboken Terminal, Newark Penn Station or Atlantic City Rail Terminal) that is a greater distance than the terminal printed on your ticket/pass. The fee is the difference between (1) the one-way fare from your originating station to the terminal printed on your ticket and (2) the one-way fare from your originating station to your new terminal.

**RECEIVE YOUR MONTHLY PASS BY MAIL.** Purchase your NJ TRANSIT monthly Bus Pass, Rail Pass, Rail Pass & PATH 40 Trip QuickCard, Rail Pass & Hoboken Ferry or Hoboken Ferry Ticket through the mail using your personal check, TransitChek Voucher, American Express, Visa, MasterCard or Discover credit card. To join, simply complete and mail in an application, found at major stations or call 1 (973) 491-8491.

**BUSINESSPASS** lets you purchase your monthly bus or rail pass at work. Legislation enables you to use pre-tax dollars towards your commute. Have your employer call 1 (973) 491-7600 for information on BusinessPass and TransitChek.

**TICKET REFUNDS** are issued at NJ TRANSIT Rail Ticket Offices if you present wholly, unused tickets, purchased with cash. The following ticket types may be presented at one time for a cash refund: up to five One-Way or Round-Trip Excursion tickets and one 10-Trip Ticket. Weekly and monthly passes, partially used tickets, and tickets purchased with credit or debit cards, must be mailed for refund. If used, the applicable one-way fare will be deducted for each fare/portion used. Passes submitted before the start of the validity period will be refunded at the purchase price. Passes submitted after the start of the validity period will have two full one-way fares deducted for each business day from the start of the validity period to the date of the refund request. Mail rail ticket refund requests to NJ TRANSIT Rail Refund Department, One Penn Plaza East, Newark, NJ 07105-2246 or present at an NJ TRANSIT ticket window for forwarding.
